Nature of awards

Certificates of recognition will be awarded by the City of College Park for special efforts by its citizens, organizations, and businesses to promote the welfare of the environment.

Categories of awards

1. Environmental 3-R's 'Reduce - Reuse - Recycle'
2. Environmentally Friendly Landscaping and Beautification
3. Conservation of Natural Resources
4. Other Environmental Achievements

Purpose of awards

- ✓ To commend those who have made outstanding local contributions to our healthy environment.
- ✓ To increase environmental awareness of the community.
- ✓ To encourage wider appreciation and adoption of environmentally sound practices.

Nomination for awards

Anyone may nominate an eligible resident, organization, or business, (including oneself!) for consideration.

Here are just a few examples of many potential Green Award candidates:

- ✓ A business that minimizes the use of non-recyclable materials or packaging
- ✓ A neighbor whose visually pleasing landscaping also provides wildlife habitat or other benefits
- ✓ A club or youth group that reuses containers to create a crafts project
- ✓ A gardener who limits the use of water, chemicals, or power equipment while enhancing our environment

Eligibility for awards

Residents of College Park, as well as businesses, organizations, associations, and institutions which operate or are located in the City are eligible.
