
BIKESHARE - MBIKE

PEPCO ELECTRIC POWER LINE TREE WORK

PEPCO has begun power line clearance work by pruning and removing trees and vegetation growing too close to electric power lines, transformers and utility poles. Planning for additional tree work is continuing; tree crews will continue work throughout

CAMPFIRE SAFETY

Campfires are a wonderful way to bring friends and families together (and eat delicious s'mores), so here are a few safety tips to help prevent accidents:

- If campfires are permitted (check with your local fire department), they need to be at least 25 feet away from structures or anything that can burn
- Clear the campfire area of any dry leaves, sticks, overhanging low branches or shrubs
- Attend to the campfire at all times
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids
- Always have a hose, bucket of water or shovel and dirt/sand nearby to put out the fire, and make sure to put it out completely before leaving the site

BURGLARY PREVENTION

FYI: You can greatly reduce the risk of being burglarized by taking simple steps to make your home more difficult to enter and less enticing to would-be burglars. The greatest weapons in the fight to prevent burglaries are light, time and noise!

Here are some ideas to help prevent burglary:

- Make your home look occupied, and make it difficult to break in.
- Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave the house or go to bed. Even if it is for a short time, lock your doors.
- Leave lights on when you go out. If you are going to be away for a length of time, connect some lamps to automatic timers to turn them on in the evening and off during the day.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers or flyers build up while you are away. Arrange with the Post Office to hold your mail, or arrange for a friend or neighbor to take them regularly.

- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended time.
- Check your locks on doors and windows and replace them with secure devices as necessary.
- Pushbutton locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- Sliding glass doors are vulnerable. Special locks are available for better security.
- Targeting the Outside:
 - Have adequate exterior lighting. A motion-sensitive light is recommended for backyards.
 - Trim trees and shrubs so that they cannot be used as hiding places for intruders.
 - Make sure your door hinges are on the inside.
- Alarms:
 - An alarm system is excellent for home security. It provides peace of mind to homeowners, especially while on vacation. There are lots of alarm systems on the market, so make several inquiries to different companies for the best security system available to you. If you have a home alarm system, don't forget to activate it!
 - Burglars know that people forget to arm their alarm systems and are not deterred by an alarm system window sticker or sign!

STREET TREE PLANTING REQUESTS

The City of College Park has a program that provides for street tree planting in right-of-way areas in City of College Park. If you're interested in requesting trees in those areas (which include the grass strip between the curb and sidewalk), College Park residents can contact the City Horticulturist at 240-487-3590 or at publicworks@collegetparkmd.gov. After a request is received, the desired location will be inspected to determine its suitability. Planning for tree planting is an ongoing activity.

MOSQUITO CONTROL AND SPRAYING

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) conducts survey counts to determine if spray threshold levels are met and if so will apply a mosquito larvicide control product in known breeding areas to control the adult mosquito population. If the spraying criteria has been met, then mosquito spraying will occur on Wednesday nights in College Park between 7:30 pm to 11:00 pm. Report mosquito problems, spray requests, and spray objections to Public Works at 240-487-3590. The City also has "dunks" available for residents to place in standing water to further help control the mosquito population. These are available at Public

Works in Davis Hall, Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m to 6:00 p.m.

SPECIAL TRASH OR BULK PICK-UPS

Have bulk or special trash that needs to be picked up? Schedule a Thursday or Friday special trash collection by calling 240-487-3590 or email publicworks@collegetparkmd.gov.

Scheduling is on a first come, first serve basis and sometimes your pick-up may need to be scheduled the following week if all the slots are full for the current week. Please place your items at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled day (or the night before) as our employees cannot come more than 4 feet onto your property to collect trash.

PLASTIC BAGS - NO LONGER ACCEPTED IN BLUE RECYCLE CART

The City of College Park's Public Works kindly requests that all residents refrain from putting any plastic bags in the blue recycling cart. If plastic bags are found in the blue cart, it will not be collected until the bags are removed on the next collection day.

The reason is because Prince George's County does NOT accept plastic bags in any form at the Materials Recovery Facility where the City's singlestream recycling is taken. Plastic bags jam the sorting machines, causing the entire facility to shut down which in turn increases maintenance costs. Plastic bags/film can still be recycled by taking them to a local grocery store, including MOMs Organic Market, Shoppers, and Giant, as all have receptacles at the front of the store for these items.

Plastic bags/film include: retail bags, plastic wrapping on food, plastic sandwich bags, dry-cleaning bags, newspaper bags, and shrink wrap (e.g. around toilet paper and bottled water). For more information on what kind of plastic bags and film should be recycled at the grocery store, visit:

WEEKLY YARD WASTE COLLECTION REMINDERS

Don't forget, yard waste (grass, flowers, leaves, soft plants, and weeds) will be picked up on your regularly scheduled collection day. Brush and logs should not be mixed in with soft (vegetative) yard waste as these types of materials cannot be processed together. Collected yard waste is processed into compost - please separate trash out of the yard trim material and

dispose in the refuse cart.

Only use paper yard waste bags or reusable containers and place them at the curb by 7:00 am on your regular collection day. Don't put your yard waste in plastic bags, as it cannot be collected. Keep in mind that a small investment in a few reusable containers can quickly outweigh the cost of continuously purchasing biodegradable paper yard waste bags; multiple containers can be stacked to reduce storage space. Tip: Drill holes in the bottom of the containers to allow water to drain out to avoid mold. Containers must display a City yard waste sticker; free stickers are available to residents at all City buildings.

SMARTLEAF® COMPOST AND WOOD MULCH

SMARTLEAF® compost and wood mulch are both available for sale at the Department of Public Works in Davis Hall. SMARTLEAF (screened compost) is \$28.00 per cubic yard and Wood Mulch is \$12.00 per cubic yard. Material may be picked up at Davis Hall Monday through Friday, 8:00 – 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. Or have it delivered for an additional fee. Delivered material cannot be unloaded in the street or right-of-way and there must be a paved or hard surface for our trucks to drive over. KEEP GRASS CLIPPINGS OFF THE STREET!

As you take care of your lawn this season, please take care not to sweep or blow grass and leaves into the street. Lawn clippings and debris that are left in the street wash into storm drains and storm sewers, potentially clogging them, which may result in flooding. Debris that washes into storm sewers is also transported through local waterways and eventually to the Chesapeake Bay, threatening aquatic life.

What should you do instead? Here are some options:

1. Place them in paper bags or reusable containers for weekly curbside pickup (on the same day as your trash and recycling collection).
2. Leave the cut grass on the lawn to recycle the nutrients, or start a compost pile in your backyard.
3. The Committee for a Better Environment (CBE) has produced brochures titled "Grass Clippings...Let 'em Lay!" and "Composting in 4 Easy Steps" to give you some ideas on how to manage grass clippings in an environmentally-responsible way. Visit
