PAINT BRANCH PARKWAY RENAMED TO CAMPUS DRIVE

As of July 1, 2016, Paint Branch Parkway has been officially renamed Campus Drive. The 1.7 mile stretch that was Paint Branch Parkway boasts a burgeoning research and innovation district including M Square Research Park, the College Park Metro Station and the future Purple Line. The name change will promote an easier wayfinding system for both residents and visitors to access the University.



PEPCO ELECTRIC POWER LINE TREE WORK

PEPCO has begun power line clearance work by pruning and removing trees and vegetation growing too close to electric power lines, transformers and utility poles. BECOME A MEMBER OF THE COLLEGE PARK TREE AND LANDSCAPE BOARD

Love trees and beautiful landscaping? The City is accepting applications for membership on the Tree and Landscape Board (TLB). The TLB works to promote proper landscape and tree maintenance

practices by educating and encouraging citizens to promote healthy trees, shrubs and ground cover on private and public lands within City limits.

The TLB works with the City's Department of Public Works to:

- Enhance the beauty of College Park.
- Plant, maintain, or remove trees, shrubs and ground covers in or upon public ways or public areas within the city limits.
- Ensure that the trees, shrubs, and ground covers located on public property are properly installed, maintained, and removed, if necessary.
- Prevent landscape conditions that may result in injury to persons using the public ways and areas or damage to public property.
- Limit the spread of diseases or pests.
- Encourage citizens to adopt practices that promote and protect healthy trees, shrubs and ground covers on private land.

Individuals interested in serving on the TLB should have interest and expertise in gardening, landscaping, surrounding environment, trees, and wildlife habitat. THE JACK PERRY AWARD



In February 2013, the College Park City Council established an award in recognition of Councilman John Edward "Jack" Perry. Councilman Perry served on the College Park City Council from 1979 to 1983 and from 1989 to 2011, for a total of 26 years. From the time he moved to College Park's Berwyn neighborhood in 1969, until his

death in 2012, Jack was deeply committed to serving his community, which he demonstrated by spending many hours working to improve the quality of life for all who lived and worked in College Park. Through the years, he volunteered on numerous associations, boards, coalitions, task forces and committees at the neighborhood, city, county and state levels. This Award will recognize a member of the community who emulates Councilman Jack Perry's legacy of public service.

Eligibility: To be eligible for the award, a person must be at least 18 years of age and a registered voter or legal resident of College Park.

Criteria: The Jack Perry award will recognize a

College Park resident who has participated to an extraordinary degree in neighborhood, civic, or municipal affairs within the City in a manner that improves public spaces, fosters community cohesion, eradicates blight, informs discussion of public issues, provides leadership, and/or furthers the best interests of the City as a whole.

Nominations: From May 15 to July 15 each year, any resident, neighborhood association or organization in the City may submit a nomination for the Jack Perry Award. Nominations should be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for the City of College Park, 4500 Knox Road, College Park, MD, 20740, or by email to jsmiller@collegeparkmd.gov. Nominations will be reviewed by a Committee that includes a member of the Perry family. This non-monetary award will be presented by the City Council in the fall.

NEW CITY SERVICES AT DAVIS HALL

Great News! The City of College Park now provides new services at its Davis Hall location (9217 51st Avenue) to better serve the residents of College Park. The following services are now offered at the Davis Hall lobby window from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday:

- Payment and processing for all parking zone permits

BURGLARY PREVENTION

FYI: You can greatly reduce the risk of being burglarized by taking simple steps to make your home more difficult to enter and less enticing to would-be burglars. The greatest weapons in the fight to prevent burglaries are light, time and noise!

Here are some ideas to help prevent burglary:

- Make your home look occupied, and make it difficult to break in.
- Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave the house or go to bed. Even if it is for a short time, lock your doors.
- Leave lights on when you go out. If you are going to be away for a length of time, connect some lamps to automatic timers to turn them on in the evening and off during the day.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers or flyers build up while you are away. Arrange with the Post Office to hold your mail, or arrange for a friend or neighbor to take them regularly.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended time.
- Check your locks on doors and windows and replace them with secure devices as necessary.
- Pushbutton locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- Sliding glass doors are vulnerable. Special locks are available for better security.
- Targeting the Outside:
 - Have adequate exterior lighting. A motion-sensitive light is recommended for backyards.
 - Trim trees and shrubs so that they cannot be used as hiding places for intruders.
 - Make sure your door hinges are on the inside.
- Alarms:
 - An alarm system is excellent for home security. It provides peace of mind to homeowners, especially while on vacation. There are lots of alarm systems on the market, so make several inquiries to different companies for the best security system available to you. If you have a

- home alarm system, don't forget to activate it!
- Burglars know that people forget to arm their alarm systems and are not deterred by an alarm system window sticker or sign!

PLASTIC BAGS - NO LONGER ACCEPTED IN BLUE RECYCLE CART

The City of College Park's Public Works kindly requests that all residents refrain from putting any plastic bags in the blue recycling cart. If plastic bags are found in the blue cart, it will not be collected until the bags are removed on the next collection day.

The reason is because Prince George's County does NOT accept plastic bags in any form at the Materials Recovery Facility where the City's singlestream recycling is taken. Plastic bags jam the sorting machines, causing the entire facility to shut down which in turn increases maintenance costs. Plastic bags/film can still be recycled by taking them to a local grocery store, including MOMs Organic Market, Shoppers, and Giant, as all have receptacles at the front of the store for these items.

Plastic bags/film include: retail bags, plastic wrapping on food, plastic sandwich bags, dry-cleaning bags, newspaper bags, and shrink wrap (e.g. around toilet paper and bottled water). WEEKLY YARD WASTE COLLECTION REMINDERS

Don't forget, yard waste (grass, flowers, leaves, soft plants, and weeds) will be picked up on your regularly scheduled collection day. Brush and logs should not be mixed in with soft (vegetative) yard waste as these types of materials cannot be processed together. Collected yard waste is processed into compost - please separate trash out of the yard trim material and dispose in the refuse cart.

Only use paper yard waste bags or reusable containers and place them at the curb by 7:00 am on your regular collection day. Don't put your yard waste in plastic bags, as it cannot be collected. Keep in mind that a small investment in a few reusable containers can quickly outweigh the cost of continuously purchasing biodegradable paper yard waste bags; multiple containers can be stacked to reduce storage space. Tip: Drill holes in the bottom of the containers to allow water to drain out to avoid mold. Containers must display a City yard waste sticker; free stickers are available to residents at all City buildings.

SMARTLEAF® COMPOST

SMARTLEAF® compost and wood mulch are both available for sale at the Department of Public Works in Davis Hall. SMARTLEAF (screened compost) is \$28.00 per cubic yard and Wood Mulch is \$12.00 per cubic yard. Material may be picked up at Davis Hall Monday through Friday, 8:00 – 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. Or have it delivered for an additional fee. Delivered material cannot be unloaded in the street or right-of-way and there must be a paved or hard surface for our trucks to drive over. KEEP GRASS CLIPPINGS OFF THE STREET!

As you take care of your lawn this season, please take care not to sweep or blow grass and leaves into the street. Lawn clippings and debris that are left in the street wash into storm drains and storm sewers, potentially clogging them, which may result in flooding. Debris that washes into storm sewers is also transported through local waterways and eventually to the Chesapeake Bay, threatening aquatic life.

What should you do instead? Here are some options:

1. Place them in paper bags or reusable containers for weekly curbside pickup (on the same day as your trash and recycling collection).
2. Leave the cut grass on the lawn to recycle the nutrients, or start a compost pile in your backyard.
3. The Committee for a Better Environment (CBE) has produced brochures titled "Grass Clippings...Let 'em Lay!" and "Composting in 4 Easy Steps" to give you some ideas on how to manage grass clippings in an environmentally-responsible way.
