COUNCIL ACTION

During the Regular Meeting on May 13, 2014, the College Park City Council took the following actions:

- Adopted a Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the City of College Park supporting Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development Neighborhood BusinessWorks Program financing to The Board and Brew.
- Approved the purchase of three replacement automobiles: One 2014 Ford Focus S Standard Sedan from Hertrich Fleet Services, Inc., Denton, MD at a cost of \$16,690.00 from the State of Maryland BPO 001B4400359, and two 2014 Honda Insight Hybrid Sedans from Criswell Honda, Germantown, MD at \$19,490.00 each from the State of Maryland BPO 001B440367, for a total cost for the three vehicles of \$55,670, which is funded in the FY '14 budget in CIP program number 925061.
- Voted to voice no objection to the application for a new Class B, Beer and Wine License for the use of Ben and Brian Games, LLC, t/a The Board and Brew, 8150 Baltimore Avenue, Suite F2&G, College Park, subject to the applicant entering into a Property Use Agreement with the City, and authorizing the City Manager to sign the PUA, and staff to testify at the BOLC hearing.
- Supported the Preliminary Plan of Subdivision 4-13020 for University Bible Fellowship Church subject to conditions.
- Adopted A Resolution Of The Mayor And Council Of The City Of College Park Setting Forth Our Commitment To Pursue Policy Goals Under The Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) Cities Campaign.
- Approved a letter to State Highway Administration on undergrounding utilities on US 1 between Paint Branch Parkway and Greenbelt Road.
- Adopted a Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the City of College Park, Maryland Adopting Program Guidelines for the Commercial and Multi-Family Recycling Grant Program.
- Appointed Bob Catlin to the College Park Housing Authority and Douglas Shontz to the Neighborhood Stabilization Committee and to the Sustainable Maryland Certified Green Team.

NEW INFORMATION ABOUT CITY OF COLLEGE PARK AUTOMATED SPEED ENFORCEMENT



THE JACK PERRY AWARD

In February 2013, the College Park City Council unanimously adopted Council Resolution 13-R-04 establishing an award in recognition of Councilman John Edward "Jack" Perry.

Councilman Perry served on the College Park City Council from 1979 to 1983 and from 1989 to 2011, for a total of 26 years. From the time he moved to College Park's Berwyn neighborhood in 1969, until his death in 2012, Jack was deeply committed to serving

his community, which he demonstrated by spending many hours working to improve the quality of life for all who lived and worked in College Park. Through the years, he volunteered on numerous associations, boards, coalitions, task forces and committees at the neighborhood, city, county and state levels. This Award will recognize a member of the community who emulates Councilman Jack Perry's legacy of public service.

Eligibility: To be eligible for the award, a person must be at least 18 years of age and a registered voter or legal resident of College Park.

Criteria: The Jack Perry award will recognize a College Park resident who has participated to an extraordinary degree in neighborhood, civic, or municipal affairs within the City in a manner that improves public spaces, fosters community cohesion, eradicates blight, informs discussion of public issues, provides leadership, and/or furthers the best interests of the City as a whole.

Nominations: From May 15 to July 15 each year, any resident, neighborhood association or organization in the City may submit a nomination for the Jack Perry Award. Nominations should be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for the City of College Park, 4500 Knox Road, College Park, MD, 20740, or by e-mail to jsmiller@collegeparkmd.gov. Nominations will be reviewed by a Committee that includes a member of the Perry family. This non-monetary award will be presented by the City Council in the fall.

JUNE AND JULY ARE PEAK MONTHS FOR SUMMER GRILLING ACCIDENTS

Be sure to use safe grilling practices as the peak months for grilling fires approach - June and July. Gas grills constitute a higher risk, having been involved in an annual average of 7,200 home fires in 2007-2011, while charcoal or other solid-fueled grills were involved in an annual average of 1,400 home fires.

Facts & figures

In 2007-2011, U.S. fire departments responded to an average of 8,800 home and outside fires. These 8,800 fires caused an annual average of 10 civilian deaths, 140 civilian injuries and \$96 million in direct property damage.

More than one-quarter (27%) of the home structure fires involving grills started on a courtyard, terrace or patio, 29% started on an exterior balcony or open porch, and 6% started in the kitchen.

In almost half (43%) of the home outdoor fires in which grills were involved, half (51%) of the outside gas grills, and 29% of gas grill structure fires, the fire started when a flammable or combustible gas or liquid caught fire.
