### **MOSQUITO WORKSHOP AND ZIKA VIRUS PREVENTION**

Join us in welcoming Jeannine Dorothy, Entomologist with the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) as she educates us about the types of mosquitoes in our area, their habitat and diseases they might carry, as well as what you can do to help reduce the population of mosquitoes in your neighborhood.

The primary goal of the Mosquito Control Section of MDA is to prevent the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in humans and domestic animals. When evidence of mosquito-borne disease is detected, measures are taken to reduce vector mosquito populations to as low a level as practical. Learn what these methods are.

Workshop will discuss:

- Lifecycle of mosquitoes with a live larva and pupa display
- What steps can be taken by individuals to reduce mosquito problems
- Using repellent products to protect against mosquito-borne illnesses including Zika virus, Dengue virus and West Nile virus, and encourage pet owners to have their dogs protected against heartworm disease
- Pesticides used for mosquito control including larvicides and adulticides

## **Council Action**

In May 2016, the College Park City Council took the following actions:

- Approved free parking in the downtown parking garage and the City Hall surface lot on weeknights from 5:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m., and all day on Saturday, from now until August 13, 2016. Parking is always free on Sundays.
- Supported the application by Fishnet Restaurant, LLC, for a refillable container (growler) permit from the Prince George's County Board of License Commissioners, subject to the applicant entering into an Amended Property Use Agreement with the City.
- Awarded a contract to Management Advisory Group International, Inc. of Woodbridge, Virginia in an amount not to exceed \$35,000 for a Job Classification and Compensation Study.
- Ratified the negotiated Agreement between the City and AFSCME Local 1209-C effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019.
- Approved a Field Use Reservation Application for Duvall Field from M&M Learning Center for Family Fun Day, Saturday, May 21, 2016.
- Approved a Sunday Field Use Reservation Application for Duvall Field from Boy Scout Troop 740 for Barbecue Fundraiser, Sunday, May 22, 2016.
- Introduced Ordinance 16-O-03, An Ordinance Of The Mayor And Council Of The City Of College Park, Amending Chapter 15, "Boards, Commissions And Committees".
- Approved a letter of support to Prince George's County for the establishment of a food truck hub at 7413 Baltimore Avenue to be coordinated by College Park Ventures.
- Appointed Stuart Adams to the Recreation Board, and reappointed Lisa Miller and Paul Carlson to the Neighborhood Quality of Life Committee, and Judith Oarr to the Recreation Board.
- Awarded a contract to DMD Data Systems of Frankfort, Kentucky for \$77,560.90 for the purchase of servers, VMWare and Lenovo storage equipment.
- Approved a Four Cities Letter to the GSA

expressing support for the FBI relocation to Greenbelt Station and for considering proximity to a Metro station a determining factor in location selection.

- Amended, and then adopted, Ordinance 16-O-02, An Ordinance of the Mayor and Council of the City of College Park, Maryland to Adopt the Fiscal Year 2017 Operating and Capital Budget of the City of College Park, Maryland.
- Authorized SunTrust Master Lease #3 to fund Fleet Purchases.
- Authorized the City Manager to sign a change request for the new Public Works modular building for an emergency generator (approximately \$150,000).
- Approved the display of the Pride flag as a banner on the front of City Hall for one week from June 6 – 13, 2016.
- Approved a letter in support of the University of Maryland Department of Transportation Services grant application to the Maryland Department of Transportation for an \$85,000 grant for bike infrastructure enhancements.



## THE JACK PERRY AWARD

In February 2013, the College Park City Council established an award in recognition of Councilman John Edward "Jack" Perry.

Councilman Perry served on the College Park



City Council from 1979 to 1983 and from 1989 to 2011, for a total of 26 years. From the time he moved to College Park's Berwyn neighborhood in 1969, until his death in 2012, Jack was deeply committed to serving his community, which he

demonstrated by spending many hours working to improve the quality of life for all who lived and worked in College Park. Through the years, he volunteered on numerous associations, boards, coalitions, task forces and committees at the neighborhood, city, county and state levels. This Award will recognize a member of the community who emulates Councilman Jack Perry's legacy of public service.

**Eligibility:** To be eligible for the award, a person must be at least 18 years of age and a registered voter or legal resident of College Park.

**Criteria:** The Jack Perry award will recognize a College Park resident who has participated to an extraordinary degree in neighborhood, civic, or municipal affairs within the City in a manner that improves public spaces, fosters community cohesion, eradicates blight, informs discussion of public issues, provides leadership, and/or furthers the best interests of the City as a whole.

**Nominations:** From May 15 to July 15 each year, any resident, neighborhood association or organization in the City may submit a nomination for the Jack Perry Award. Nominations should be submitted in writing to the City Clerk for the City of College Park, 4500 Knox Road, College Park, MD, 20740, or by email to [jsmiller@collegeparkmd.gov](mailto:jsmiller@collegeparkmd.gov). Nominations will be reviewed by a Committee that includes a member of the Perry family. This non-monetary award will be presented by the City Council in the fall.

State Law requires that all cats, dogs and ferrets be vaccinated against rabies by four (4) months of age, and be kept current. The best thing you can do to protect yourself, your family and community from rabies is to vaccinate your cats, dogs and ferrets against this fatal disease.

Only cats, dogs and ferrets over three (3) months old will be vaccinated. A responsible adult must bring the pet. You must bring proof of prior rabies vaccination. Secure all animals: dogs on a leash, cats and ferrets in a carrier box. There will be a \$10 fee per vaccination. BRING EXACT CHANGE!

No person shall own, keep or harbor any dog/cat/ferret over the age of four months, unless the pet is licensed. Citizens 65 years of age and older (proof of age required) may obtain two free pet licenses per year, provided their animal(s) is spayed/neutered and is up-to-date on rabies vaccination(s).

Prince George's Animal Management Division wants you to know: If you can't adopt, foster. If you can't foster, sponsor. If you can't sponsor, volunteer. If you can't volunteer, donate. Educate, network, and spread the word. Everyone can do something, large or small, to help save a life.

## **BURGLARY PREVENTION**

The risk of being burglarized can be greatly reduced by taking simple steps to make your home more difficult to enter and less enticing to would-be burglars. Remember the greatest weapons in the fight to prevent burglaries are light, time and noise.

- Make your home look occupied, and make it difficult to break in.

- Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave the house or go to bed. Even if it is for a short time, lock your doors.
- Leave lights on when you go out. If you are going to be away for a length of time, connect some lamps to automatic timers to turn them on in the evening and off during the day.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, newspapers or flyers build up while you are away. Arrange with the Post Office to hold your mail, or arrange for a friend or neighbor to take them regularly.
- Arrange for your lawn to be mowed if you are going away for an extended time.
- Check your locks on doors and windows and replace them with secure devices as necessary.
- Pushbutton locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- Sliding glass doors are vulnerable. Special locks are available for better security.
- Other windows may need better locks. Check with a locksmith or hardware store for alternatives.

Targeting the Outside:

- Have adequate exterior lighting. A motion-sensitive light is recommended for backyards.
- Trim trees and shrubs so that they cannot be used as hiding places for intruders.
- Make sure your door hinges are on the inside.

Alarms:

An alarm system is excellent for home security. It provides peace of mind to homeowners, especially while on vacation. There is a wide variety of alarm systems on the market. Make several inquiries to different companies for the best security system available to you. If you have a home alarm system, use it! Activate your alarm system — Alarm systems are only useful when you remember to activate them.

Many individuals have alarm systems but do not arm them because it is inconvenient. Many burglars know this and will not be deterred by a window sticker or sign indicating that the home has an alarm system.

## **PLASTIC BAGS NO LONGER ACCEPTED IN BLUE RECYCLE CART**

Public Works requests all residents to refrain from putting any plastic bags in the blue recycling cart. If plastic bags are found in the blue cart, it will not be collected. All plastic bags/film need to be removed from the cart, then it will be emptied on your next collection day. Shredded paper can be contained in a paper bag, secured by folding the top and stapling it closed. Residents should place approved recyclables loose in the blue cart.

Prince George's County does NOT accept plastic bags in any form at the Materials Recovery Facility where the City's singlestream recycling is taken. These bags jam the sorting machines causing the entire facility to shut down, and it increases maintenance costs. Plastic bags/film can still be recycled by taking them to a local grocery store. MOMs Organic Market, Shoppers, and Giant all have receptacles at the front of the store for these items.

Plastic bags/film include: retail bags, plastic wrapping on food, plastic sandwich bags, dry-cleaning bags, newspaper bags, and shrink wrap (e.g. around toilet paper and bottled water). ## **USED MOTOR OIL RECYCLING**

Motor oil must not be disposed of in our trash or recycling carts. A receptacle for recycling used motor oil is located at Public Works facility at 9217 51st Avenue and is available to City residents, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please follow posted instructions.

The facility is for used motor oil only; other liquids such as brake fluid, antifreeze, sealants, cooking oil, pesticides, herbicides, etc. must be taken to the Prince George's County facility Thursday, Friday, or Saturday from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm at the Brown Station Landfill, located at 11611 White House Road, Upper Marlboro. ## **WEEKLY YARD WASTE COLLECTION REMINDERS**

Yard waste (grass, flowers, leaves, soft plants, and weeds) will be picked up on your regularly scheduled collection day. Brush and logs should not be mixed in with soft (vegetative) yard waste as these two types of materials are processed independently of each other. Collected yard waste is processed into compost; trash should be separated out of the yard trim material and disposed of in the refuse cart.

Use paper yard waste bags or reusable containers ONLY, and place at the curb by 7:00 am on your regular collection day. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Keep in mind that a small investment in a few reusable containers can quickly outweigh the cost of continuously purchasing biodegradable paper yard waste bags; multiple containers can be stacked to reduce storage space. Drill holes in the bottom of the containers to allow water to drain out. Containers must display a City yard waste sticker; free stickers are available to residents at all City buildings.

## **SMARTLEAF® COMPOST**

SMARTLEAF® compost is available for sale at the Department of Public Works. SMARTLEAF (screened compost) is \$28.00 per cubic yard and Wood Mulch is \$12.00 per cubic yard. Material may be picked up at Public Works Monday through Friday, 8:00 – 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. Deliveries may also be arranged for an additional fee. Delivered material cannot be unloaded in the street or right-of-way and there must be a paved or hard surface for our trucks to drive over. ## **KEEP GRASS CLIPPINGS OFF THE STREET!**

As you take care of your lawn this season, do not sweep or blow grass and leaves into the street. Lawn clippings and debris that are left in the street wash into storm drains and storm sewers, potentially clogging them, which may result in flooding. Debris that washes into storm sewers is transported through local waterways and eventually to the Chesapeake Bay, threatening aquatic life.

What should you do instead? There are several

options for your lawn clippings: Place them in paper bags or reusable containers for weekly curbside pickup (on the same day as your trash and recycling collection), leave the cut grass on the lawn to recycle the nutrients, or start a compost pile in your backyard. The Committee for a Better Environment (CBE) has produced brochures titled "Grass Clippings...Let 'em Lay!" and "Composting in 4 Easy Steps" to give you some ideas on how to manage grass clippings in an environmentally-responsible way. ## **MOSQUITO SPRAYING AND YOUR ROLE IN CONTROLLING THEM**

---

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) will apply a mosquito larvicide control product in known breeding areas, and conducts survey counts to determine if spray threshold levels are met prior to spraying to control adult mosquitoes. The MDA adult Mosquito Control Program in College Park will begin June 1 and continue into the fall. Mosquito spraying occurs on Wednesday nights in College Park, if the spray criteria are met. Report mosquito problems, spray requests, and spray objections to Public Works at 240-487-3590. The City has "dunks" available for residents to place in standing water. These are available at Public Works, Monday – Friday 8:00 am-3:30 pm.

West Nile and Zika virus are both transmitted by mosquitoes. Please read over these tips to rid your community of mosquito breeding sites.

- Clean rain gutters to allow water to flow freely.
- Remove old tires or drill drainage holes in tires used for playground equipment.
- Store plastic wading pools inside or turn them upside down when not in use.
- Turn over or remove clay pots and plastic containers.
- Dispose of all empty beverage containers, plastic wrappers, discarded toys, etc.
- Check for trapped water in plastic or canvas tarps used to cover boats, pools, etc. Arrange the tarp to drain the water.
- Pump out bilges in boats. Turn canoes and small boats upside down for storage.
- Replace water in bird baths at least twice a week.
- Remove pet food and water dishes that are not being used.
- Flush livestock water troughs twice a week.

- Don't leave garbage can lids lying upside down. Be sure water does not collect in the bottom of garbage cans.
- Flush water in the bottom of plant holders twice a week.
- Fix dripping outside water faucets.
- Turn wheelbarrows upside down when stored outside.
- Check around construction sites or do-it-yourself improvements to ensure that proper backfilling and grading prevent drainage problems.
- Check ornamental ponds, tree holes and water-holding low areas for mosquito larvae. Call the nearest Mosquito Control Office (see below) if you find, or suspect, mosquito larvae are present.
- If ditches do not flow and contain stagnant water for one week or longer, they can produce large numbers of mosquitoes. Report such conditions to a Mosquito Control Office. Do not attempt to clear these ditches because they may be protected by wetland regulations.

Brush (branches, shrubs, trees, and bamboo) and logs are collected on Thursday and Friday by appointment. Please bundle and tie items with string (do not use wire or put in plastic bags). Bundles should be less than 5 feet long and weigh less than 75 pounds.

## **RECYCLING FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS**

My Organic Market currently accepts tube and compact fluorescent light bulbs for recycling (9827 Rhode Island Avenue; 301-220-1100). Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) can be taken to Home Depot (4700 Cherry Hill Rd., 301-345-6774) or Ikea (10100 Baltimore Ave., 301-345-6552) for recycling (no tubes).

## FOAM PACKAGING RECYCLING (KEEP IT OUT OF YOUR BLUE CART)

Ever wonder what you could do with packaging foam surrounding electronics, appliances and mailed packages? Several types of foam packaging is recyclable, but should NOT be placed in your blue recycling cart. There are a few options in and around College Park that will accept different types of foam-based materials to be reused or recycled. You can take items to the following locations:
