**Petition Request For The Installation Of Residential Permit Restricted Parking In
The 9700 Block Of Narragansett Parkway**

Mayor Brayman announced that this Public Hearing was being held to discuss the petition request for the installation of Residential Permit Restricted Parking in the 9700 Block of Narragansett Parkway.

Mr. Ryan gave an overview of this request by reviewing the petition and subsequent staff work. 100% of the residents have requested this permit restriction and the petition was validated.

Mayor Brayman invited public comment.

John Meinhart, 9702 Narragansett Parkway: He submitted the petition and supports this proposal. He believes the current parking problem in the 9700 Block of Narragansett Parkway was caused by the permit parking restrictions imposed on Lackawanna Street, which pushed those parkers down to his street.

Mayor Brayman stated that the Council is proactively addressing neighborhood parking issues, particularly around the Metro station.

There being no further public comment, the public hearing was declared closed at 7:22 p.m.
