Ordinance Of The Mayor And Council Of The City Of College Park, Maryland, Amending Chapter 172 “Streets And Sidewalks” By Repealing And Reenacting §172-4 “Use Of The Public Property”, To Limit The Time During Which Construction Dumpsters And Other Receptacles Are Permitted On Public Property.

**PRESENT:** Mayor Brayman; Councilmembers Milligan, Krouse, Catlin, Perry, Fellows, Stulich, Hampton and Cook.

**ABSENT:** None.

**ALSO PRESENT:** Joe Nagro, City Manager; Janeen Miller, City Clerk; Suellen Ferguson, City Attorney; Sara Imhulse, Assistant to the City Manager; Bob Ryan, Director of Public Services; Mary Laura Fitzgerald, Rent Stabilization Program staff; Jeannie Ripley, Code Enforcement Manager.

Mayor Brayman opened the Public Hearing at 7:32 p.m. and invited Bob Ryan to give an overview. Mr. Ryan said that the City currently has a permit requirement for construction dumpsters and other storage receptacles on public property, but this ordinance would establish time limits for the permits. He reviewed those time limits. The fees and fines would remain the same. This ordinance would not require County Council approval.

Mayor Brayman invited public comment.

**David Dorsch, 4607 Calvert Road:** He supports this ordinance because it regulates dumpsters on public property.

**John Hawvermale, 1442 Excalibur Lane, Sandy Spring:** He supports this ordinance because it regulates dumpsters on public property, which would be expected by contractors. There might be a provision that the City be reimbursed for damage to the street or curb.

**Alan Tyler, 7204 Bowdoin Avenue:** Thinks Mr. Hawvermale made a good point about potential damage to the street or curb. Maybe contractors should post a bond.

Mayor Brayman indicated that action on this ordinance is scheduled for later this evening. No further public comment will be heard unless there is substantive change to the ordinance.

There being no further public comment, the hearing was adjourned at 7:39 p.m.
