

**MINUTES**  
**Public Hearing of the College Park City Council**  
**Traffic Calming Recommendation For The 9200 Block Of St. Andrews Place**

Mayor Fellows called the Public Hearing on the traffic calming recommendation for the 9200 block of St. Andrews Place to order at 7:00 p.m. and invited public testimony:

**Comments from the audience:**

**Maria Mackey, 9242 St. Andrews Place:** Spoke in favor of traffic calming. People speed up and down and something needs to be done about it. There are lots of children, people on bikes, and it is not a safe place.

**Suchitra Balachandran, President, West College Park Citizens Association:** The civic association has not had the opportunity to take a position on this item. She would like time for the community to discuss it. She believes the overall consensus is that they want traffic calming; the question is where.

**Betty Smith, 9216 St. Andrews Place:** She hopes the Council will support a speed hump to slow down traffic. It is hard for her to back out of her driveway. There is a curve on the road and cars come flying down the road. She thinks it is dangerous to pedestrians and bicyclists. She is concerned that someone is going to be injured in an accident.

**John Lindsay, 9221 St. Andrews Place:** He has lived there for 43 years. There have been problems for the last 5 years – there are more rentals in the community resulting in more automobiles moving at a greater speed than is necessary. He is concerned for the pedestrians. He sees people driving way too fast at Marlborough Way and St. Andrews. Wants some resolution before there is a terrible situation.

There being no further testimony, Mayor Fellows adjourned the Public Hearing at 7:15 p.m.
