

Paint Branch Parkway Renamed to Campus Drive

As of July 1, 2016, Paint Branch Parkway has been officially renamed Campus Drive. The 1.7 mile stretch that was Paint Branch Parkway boasts a burgeoning research and innovation district including M Square Research Park, the College Park Metro Station and the future Purple Line. The name change will promote an easier way-finding system for both residents and visitors to access the University.

FROM OUR CITY DEPARTMENTS

Department of Planning, Community and Economic Development

- Staff met with interested persons to discuss the possible expansion of mbike (bike sharing) to nearby areas outside of the City.
- State Highway Administration (SHA) held a project team meeting for the I-495/ Route 1 intersection public safety spot improvement project, where three alternative concepts were discussed. Staff was unable to attend, but will distribute the meeting minutes when they become available.
- Staff met with the Downtown College Park Management Authority (DCPMA) to plan for a student welcome event called Terps Downtown to be held on August 28 from 1-3 pm. Plans include a DJ, carnival games and scavenger hunt. These activities will be coordinated with expanded hours for the Downtown Farmers Market.

Engineering Division

- WSSC's contractor M.T. Laney has begun milling the affected streets in the Old Town area. Paving is tentatively scheduled to begin during the week of July 25th.
