

**SPECIAL SESSION MINUTES
College Park City Council
Tuesday, February 1, 2022
10:35 p.m.**

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, this was a Virtual Meeting.

22-G-47 HB 254 - State Highway Administration - Pedestrian and Bicyclist Fatalities - Infrastructure Review (Vision Zero Implementation Act of 2022)

A motion was made by Councilmember Mitchell and seconded by Councilmember Mackie to send a letter in support of HB 254, the Vision Zero Implementation Act of 2022.

22-G-49 Report on the Public or Private Conversion of State Property to Affordable Housing

A motion was made by Councilmember Kennedy and seconded by Councilmember Mackie to send a letter in support of HB 39 which would support the study/analysis of whether Surplus State Property could be used for affordable housing. No comments from the audience or council. Motion passed 8-0.
