CONGRATS SPENCER HARRIS AWARD CEREMONY WINNERS!

You probably have seen them vacuuming leaves around your house, plowing snow in your neighborhood, mulching your local playground, or whisking your refuse and recycling away every week. The City's Department of Public Works crews are the City employees you see every day working hard to make sure our City is clean, has working facilities and that our residents and visitors can walk, bike or drive safely on City sidewalks and streets.

Every year, the City recognizes those Public Works employees who have gone above and beyond in service to the City with the Spencer Harris Awards. This year's 31st annual City of College Park Spencer Harris Award Ceremony and Breakfast was held on January 25. The awards ceremony also recognizes the years of safe driving by City staff.

The Spencer Harris Award was established on May 10, 1988 by the Mayor and Council. It was named after a Public Works dispatcher who brought excellence to his position and dedicated almost twenty years to the Department. Throughout his years with us, Spencer received numerous awards for outstanding service and letters of appreciation from the public. To earn this coveted award, a Department of Public Works employee must be nominated by his/her

peers and rate highly in honesty, diligence, respect, flexibility, dedication, reliability, leadership and initiative. This year's award went to Rodney H.!

The Spencer Harris Award is not the only award given out during the event. Thomas B. won the Quality Control Recognition Award for ensuring a high standard was met while fulfilling assigned tasks. The Meritorious Service Award went to David C. for providing commendable service. Janet M. received the Special Achievement Award for demonstrating initiative to fulfill an expanded task. The Dedicated Service Award for displaying commitment, dedication and perseverance during the course of assigned tasks went to Vincent C. Last but not least, the Director's Performance Award went to David K.

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HUH? YARD WASTE IS WHAT?

Did you know that yard waste and brush are processed independently into two different end products? When putting yard waste or brush out for collection, they need to be prepared separately to ensure proper collection!

Soft yard waste includes grass, leaves, flowers, weeds and soft clippings that are less than .5 inch in diameter. These green materials are processed into Smartleaf® compost. Woody yard waste includes branches, brush and small logs greater than .5 inches in diameter, and shrubs which are processed into wood mulch.

- **Soft yard waste (green)** is picked up on your regularly scheduled collection day from mid-January until the end of October. During leaf collection season, November until early January, soft yard waste is collected when the leaf machines are collecting leaves with the vacuum that are placed at the curb.
- **Woody yard waste (brown)** is collected year-round on Thursday and Friday by appointment only. Please email publicworks@collegeparkmd.gov or call 240-487-3590 to schedule a collection.

How to properly prepare your material for collection:

- Separate soft (green) material from woody (brown) material, and place each type of source separated material in a separate container.
- Use paper yard waste bags, the beige yard waste cart, or personal reusable containers* for either type of material. *Personal containers must have a yellow City yard waste sticker; free stickers are available at City buildings.
- Bundle and tie woody brush (brown) with string, if not placed in a container; bundles should be less than 5 feet long and weigh less than 75 pounds
- Place at the curb by 7:00 am
- Do not use plastic bags, or City issued refuse or recycling carts, as it will not be collected.

THE AWC TIP OF THE MONTH - WE DON'T LOVE HEARTWORMS

Good news: heartworm disease is preventable!

Bad news: heartworm disease can be fatal and the treatment is expensive and hard on the animals. When the animals are treated, they must remain quiet for many weeks - crated and leash walked short distances a few times a day. The animal must have the equivalent of human bed rest! Heartworms are carried by infected mosquitoes that transmit the worms that grown in the lungs and hearts of the animal. Heartworms can grow up to 12 inches long!

So, if heartworms are transmitted to the animal by a mosquito, we don't have to give preventative in winter, right? No! Just like fleas and ticks, we don't know when the last mosquito will die in the fall and when the first one is going to come out in the early spring.

While there are differing opinions about the necessity and safety of giving your dog and cat heartworm preventative medications, most veterinarians recommend keeping dogs on preventative 12 months a year.

WINTER WEATHER

The City of College Park's priority during a snow event is public safety. Our goal is to clear snow and ice as quickly and efficiently as possible, restoring safe travel for emergency crews, motorists, and pedestrians. Snow and ice removal are considered emergency operations and take precedence over other Department of Public Works tasks.

The snow plan will go into effect upon the order of the City Manager or the Director of Public Works. The plan consists of an Alert Phase and an Operation Phase. Snow or icy precipitation, which requires roadway treatment, will be considered an emergency under the operational phase.

These steps will be followed during a snow emergency:

- Snow removal equipment will be dispatched to predetermined routes when snow or ice is imminent. Depending upon the weather forecast, some streets may be pretreated with a brine solution. Salting operations may begin at the onset of precipitation, depending if streets have been pretreated or not.
- Snow removal routes are divided into primary and secondary streets. Primary streets will be treated and/or cleared first, followed by secondary streets.
- When snow begins to accumulate and cover roadways, plowing operations will commence.
- Initially, one lane will be plowed on all streets to make passable. As conditions allow, all streets will then be widened and plowed curb to curb, where possible.
- City parking lots will be plowed and treated.
- Crews will be dispatched to clear sidewalks, and trails.



PARKING DURING SNOW EVENTS

Things you can do to help include:

- Move parked cars off the street so the snow plows can clear snow to the curb.
- If off-street parking is not available during predicted snowstorms, park on the even side of the road (unless your address is odd-numbered or the area across from your house is undeveloped, then park on the odd side of the street). That enables the snow plows to clear more roadway.
- Residents are responsible for clearing snow from their driveways or driveway aprons. It's recommended to clear snow after the trucks have been through. If you begin to remove snow before the trucks are finished, you may have to clear your driveway more than once.
- Don't forget to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks, storm drains and fire hydrants in front of your home.
- City crews work around the clock during snow emergencies to clear the City streets. Our crews are working as fast and safely as possible to clear the roads - we will get to your street! Your patience is greatly appreciated during these times.

Always plan to set your refuse and recycling carts out for your regularly scheduled day during snow events. Refuse and recycling collections may occur later in the day than normal.

CITY OFFICES CLOSED FEBRUARY 18

All City offices will be closed on Monday, February 18, 2019 in observance of the Presidents Day holiday.

Refuse and recycling collections will shift forward one day (Monday collections will occur on Tuesday; Tuesday collections on Wednesday; and so forth) and special collections will only occur on Friday that week.

BALTIMORE AVE ROAD CLOSURES

Starting on February 18, State Highway Administration will close two lanes on Baltimore Avenue from College Avenue to University Boulevard until November 30. Most of the work should be done during the night hours between 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

From State Highway Administration:
Northern Pipeline Construction Co.(NPL), under contract with Washington Gas(WG), will be relocating

natural gas distribution pipeline in conflict with the roadway improvement project PG624517 proposed by Maryland Department of Transportation's State Highway Administration. Construction is anticipated to start February 18th, 2019 and conclude November 30, 2019; weather and system permitting. Most work will be performed during night hours between 9:00 pm and 5:00 am. In the event of inclement weather, NPL will cease construction until suitable conditions resume.

To facilitate the relocation, two lanes of traffic will need to be closed during construction. The lanes closed will vary from the two southbound lanes and the two northbound lanes depending on the section of pipeline being relocated. Sidewalk closures will not be necessary.

LITTLE PAINT BRANCH TRAIL CLOSURES

From M-NCPPC Prince George's County Department of Parks and Recreation:

Little Paint Branch Trail Extension

- Construction will be temporarily suspended due to weather-related issues.
- The 2.2 mile project (from Cherry Hill Road to Beltsville Community Center on Sellman Road) is 90% complete.
- The contractor will return in March or April, depending on weather, to wrap up the project.
- The trail is generally passable, but has small unfinished conditions throughout, such as unpaved sections, no signage or striping, fencing needs, power pole guy wire adjustments and other features that will be completed when construction resumes.
- A major section of the trail adjacent to the Knights of Columbus property is not passable and will be fully posted as OFF LIMITS. Please do not try to use this section of trail and do not trespass on Knights of Columbus facility grounds to go around the construction site.

Little Paint Branch Trail Closure for Repairs

- Just south of Cherry Hill Road, the existing Little Paint Branch Trail is being compromised by flood waters. Environmental Quality Resources (EQR) is addressing 3 trail washout and undermining

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locations, by conducting a 4-6 week long emergency streambank stabilization project for DPR. This work is underway as of January 28, 2019, and will continue until finished. For 2-3 weeks, the trail will be closed during the hours that the contractor is working at the site--Monday through Friday, 6:30 AM to 4 PM.

- Outside of these hours and on weekends the contractor will attempt to leave the trail passable. This will require trails users to use detours on unpaved areas adjacent to the pavement. Trail users should exercise caution. The portion of trail that has fallen into the stream channel will be blocked off at all hours until the base is will remain closed until fully stabilized and new paving is applied.
