FOOD SCRAP DROP-OFF COMING SOON!

In honor of Earth Month, the Department of Public Works is pleased to announce the April start of the brand-new Food Scrap Drop-off Program!

Beginning April 1, City residents can drop off food scraps at Davis Hall (9217 51st Avenue) in the designated food scrap container. In addition, there will be drop-off locations at the Downtown and Hollywood Farmers' Markets beginning in May.

Through this free service, residents can drop-off food waste that will be composted locally at the Prince George's County Organics Compost facility.

Items that can be accepted for the drop off include: fruit and vegetable scraps; coffee grounds and tea leaves; dry goods - breads, pasta, nuts, rice and grains; dairy products, eggs and egg shells; meat, fish, poultry and bones – cooked or uncooked; food soiled paper products – napkins, paper towels, coffee filters, and tea bags.

The first 50 residents to visit the Department of Public Works during regular business hours (starting April 1) can pick up a free 5-gallon container for their food scraps!

Not sure how to get started? Food scrap composting is very easy. Separate the accepted food scrap items from other trash and place in either a compostable bag (available at all locations for free) or in a container with a closed lid (for example - empty coffee containers with sealing lids are great for this). Once it gets full, bring the food scraps to the designated drop off area at Davis Hall or during the farmers markets and follow the instructions provided to dispose!

Just a quick note, please do not include plastic products of any kind, pet or human waste, diapers, shells, grease or fats, or ash from wood or charcoal as they cannot be accepted.

THE AWC TIP OF THE MONTH: PROTECT YOUR PETS FROM FLEAS & TICKS

This tip is brought to you by the City's Animal Welfare Committee.

Fleas and ticks are not just a seasonal issue – they are a year round problem in the mid Atlantic region. As the weather warms in spring these pests multiply.

Fleas not only cause allergic reactions but they can also transmit parasitic infections. Ticks serve as hosts for the organisms that cause diseases such as Lyme disease and ehrlichiosis which can be transmitted to your pet. These diseases have been detected in pets in our area.

The best way to protect your pet is to have a well kept yard and when walking your dog avoid woody areas and tall grass. There are several topical and oral products on the market for year round protection. Each product is specific for species and weight of the animal. Never use a canine product on cats – not even a small amount. Check with your veterinarian for the best product for your situation and always read the label.

BULK TRASH

Last year the City conducted a third-party review of the bulk trash collections and policies. The resulting report provided staff and City Council with many recommendations that will better protect City staff; reduce excessive bulk collections paid by all taxpayers; improve efficiencies and the environment; and bring City bulk collection policies more in line with other municipalities.

What is bulk trash?

Bulk trash generally refers to items too big or not appropriate to place into the trash cart, such as appliances (dishwashers, refrigerators, washers, dryers, etc.), hot water heaters, boilers, radiators, sinks, basins, tubs, toilets, vehicle parts, furniture, bikes, grills, etc. The City policy requires residents to schedule these pick-ups prior to putting the items on the curb.

What is the problem?

Currently, any resident, tenant, and even a contractor can place unlimited amounts of bulky trash—including some construction debris and even entire trees—near the curb for the City's Department of Public Works (DPW) to pick up without any City fee. DPW staff regularly encounter huge piles of trash, furniture, tree trunks, and kitchen renovation debris that block sidewalks or cover part of a yard. These items could fall and block the sidewalks, and often materials contain exposed nails, sharp edges or hidden dangers to our Public Works crews. Sometimes the City must use specialized equipment to remove the items.



Unfortunately, this service is being over-used by a small percentage of residents, contractors and landlords; therefore, the city is recommending changes to this service to provide equitable service to all residents.

What major changes are proposed?

If approved by Mayor and Council, City residents will have a limit of four free bulky trash collections a year with a total of 20 bulk items collected. For instance, if you're getting a new living room set, still schedule a bulk trash collection and those items will be picked up at no extra charge. Have a broken stool or some broken pots that can't be reused or donated? Put those items in your trash cart and they won't be counted as bulk trash. The City expects the vast



majority of residents will not need more than four bulk collections or more than 20 items.

If you need more than 20 bulk items collected, the City would assess a \$20 fee for each item more than 20. Oversized, overweight woody materials and/or excessive quantities of woody or other types of materials that require specialized equipment will incur a fee of \$100 per dispatch. TVs, monitors, and freon-containing units will incur a \$25 collection charge for each unit and each unit will count toward the number and quantity of annual bulky refuse collections.

Residents can continue to drop off bulky refuse items at Public Works during scheduled clean-up months. These drop-offs will not be included in their annual count of collection quantities or volumes. City residents can also take items to the Prince George's County landfill for disposal.

The bulky refuse recommendations will contribute to the City's sustainability efforts by encouraging recycling, reuse or donation of items that are no longer used. For more information about the proposed changes, visit collegetparkmd.gov/dpw.

THE CBE TIP OF THE MONTH: RECYCLE YOUR TEXTILES!

This tip is brought to you by the City's Committee for a Better Environment.

Did you know, the Council for Textile Recycling estimates that the average American throws away more than 70 pounds of clothing and other textiles each year? That's a lot of clothes that go into the landfill!

Unwanted clothing and textiles do not belong in the trash. Items that are dry and odorless should be donated regardless of their condition. Don't forget - donations can be tax deductible! Many large scale non-profit textile collectors have relationships with secondary markets that purchase unsellable clothing for use as wiping rags and for industrial fill material.



BALTIMORE AVE ROAD CLOSURES

Starting on February 18, State Highway Administration will close two lanes on Baltimore Avenue from College Avenue to University Boulevard until November 30. Most of the work should be done during the night hours between 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

From State Highway Administration:
Northern Pipeline Construction Co.(NPL), under contract with Washington Gas(WG), will be relocating natural gas distribution pipeline in conflict with the roadway improvement project PG624517 proposed by Maryland Department of Transportation's State Highway Administration. Construction is anticipated to start February 18th, 2019 and conclude November 30, 2019; weather and system permitting. Most work

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will be performed during night hours between 9:00 pm and 5:00 am. In the event of inclement weather, NPL will cease construction until suitable conditions resume.

To facilitate the relocation, two lanes of traffic will need to be closed during construction. The lanes closed will vary from the two southbound lanes and the two northbound lanes depending on the section of pipeline being relocated. Sidewalk closures will not be necessary.

BUS RELOCATION AT THE COLLEGE PARK METRO

From Maryland Purple Line:

Effective March 18, 2019, the College Park Metro Bus Loop access will be closed long-term for Purple Line construction. The existing 5 bus stops within the bus loop will be relocated to the southbound right-hand lane of River Road. Additional bus stops may be added at a later date; at that time a revised notice will be provided. See illustration below for long-term bus stop locations.

Please note that the right-hand southbound lane along River Road will have buses queue up at the temporary bus stops between 5 a.m. and 11 p.m.
