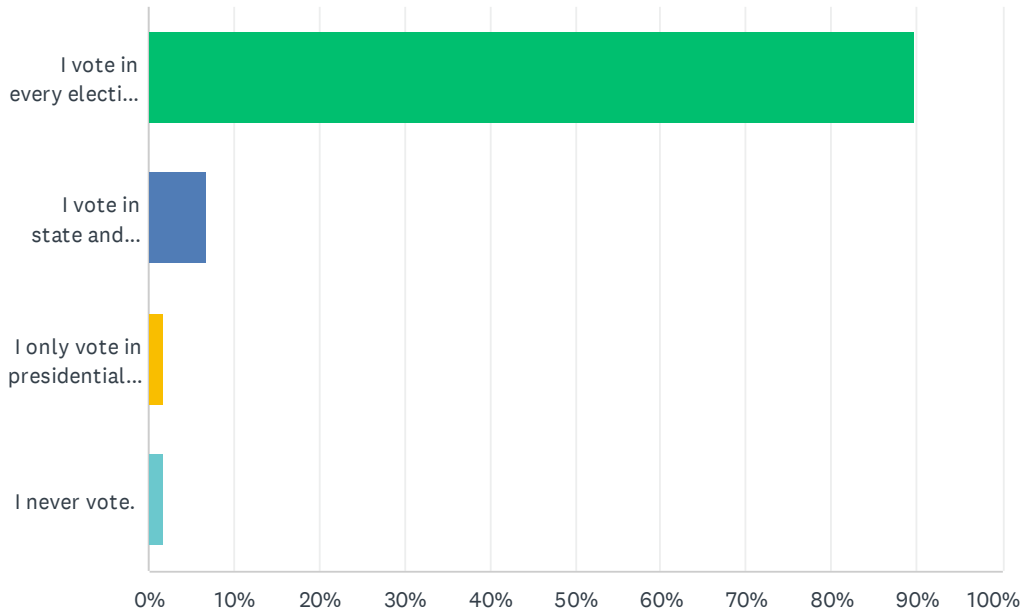


## Q1 What best describes your voting habits?

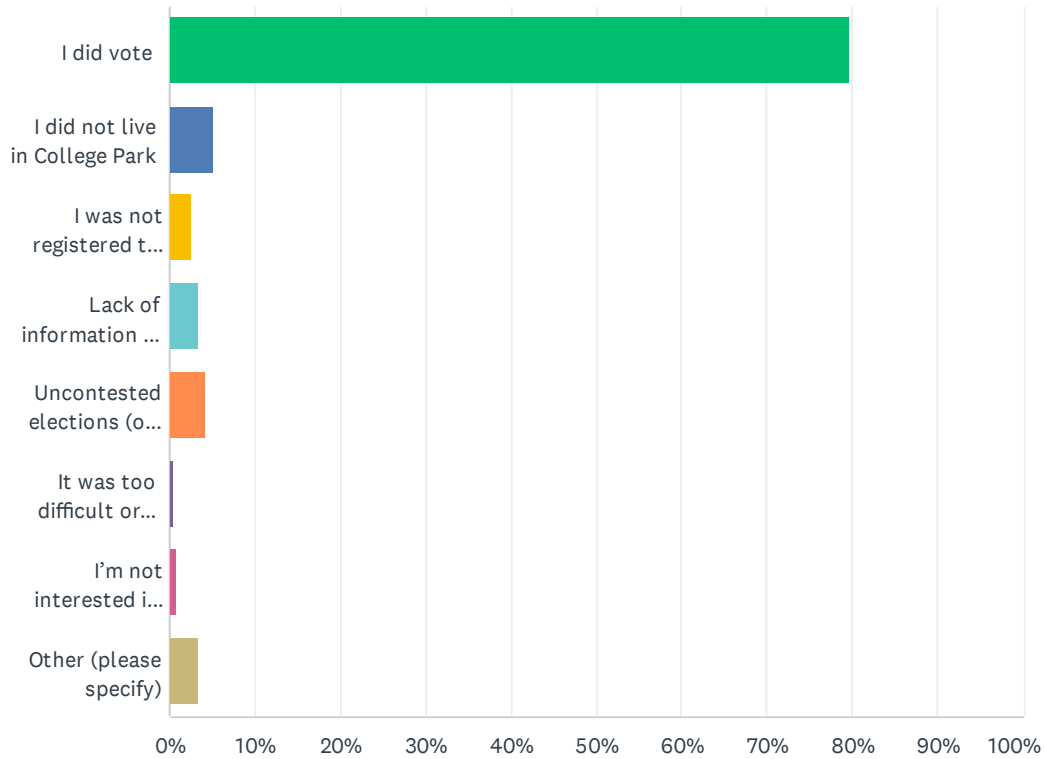

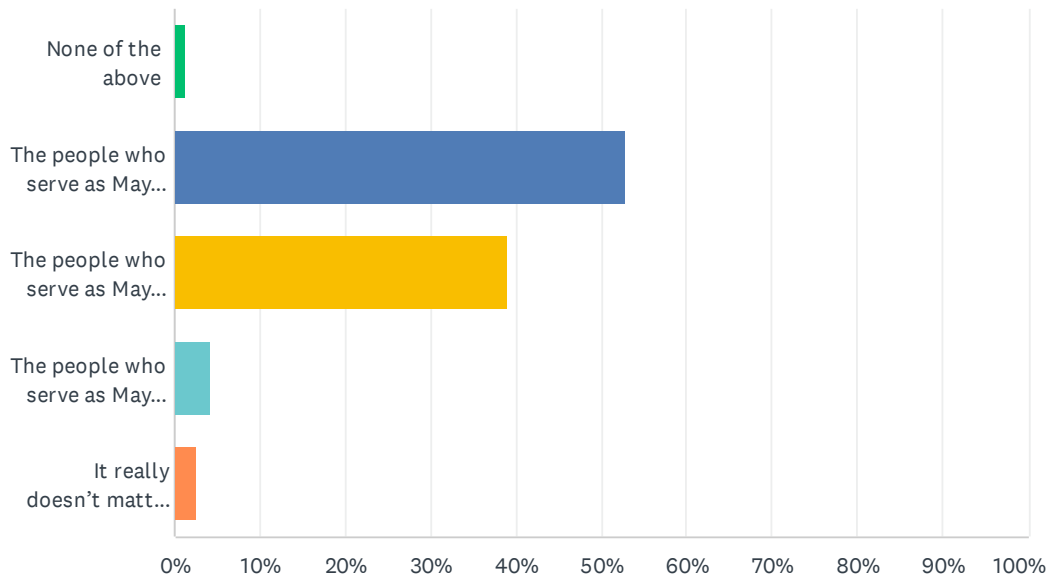

### Q3 Which statement do you agree with most?

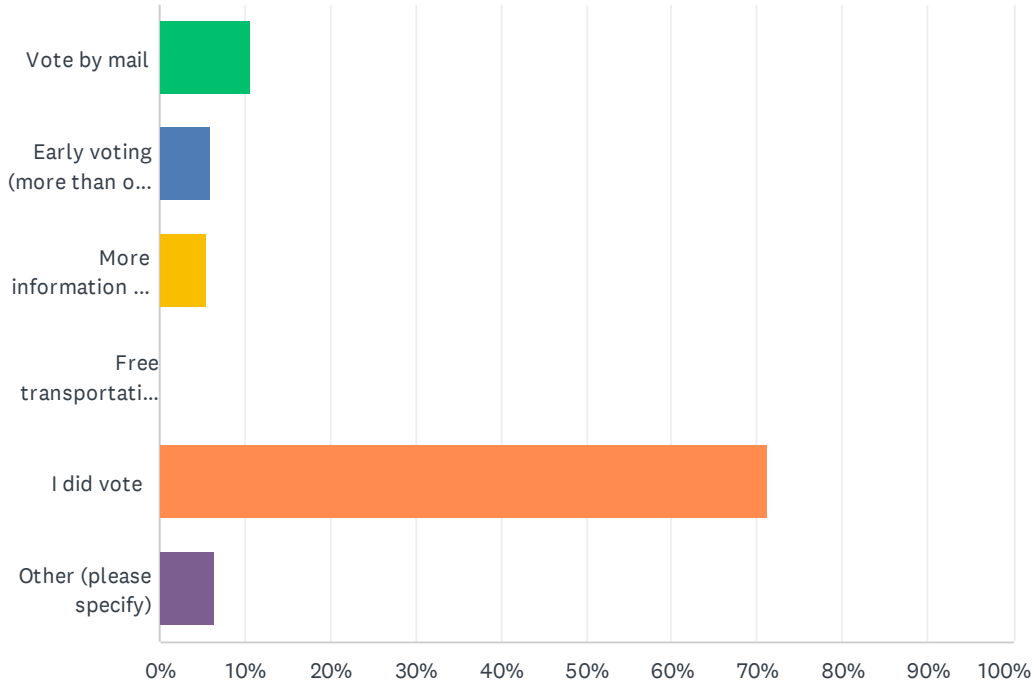

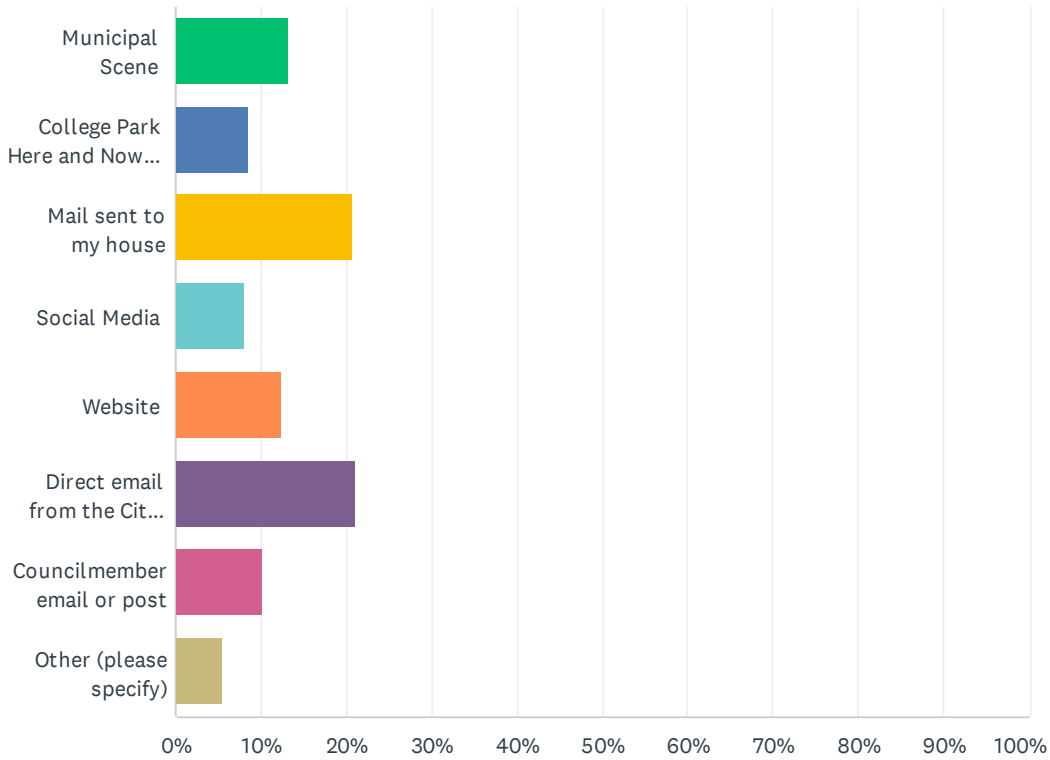

## Q8 Are you a college or university student?

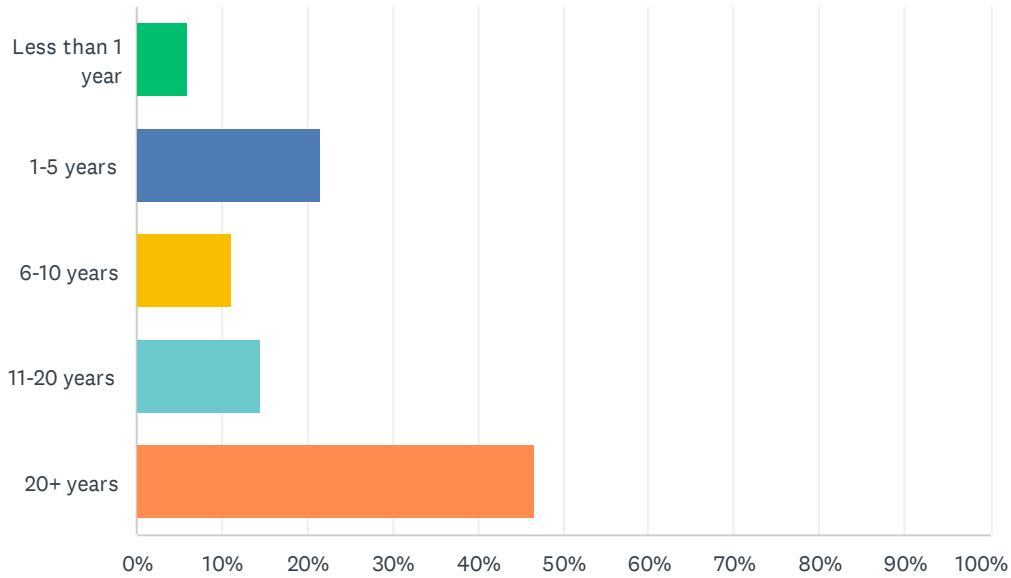

## Q9 Approximately how many years have you lived in College Park?

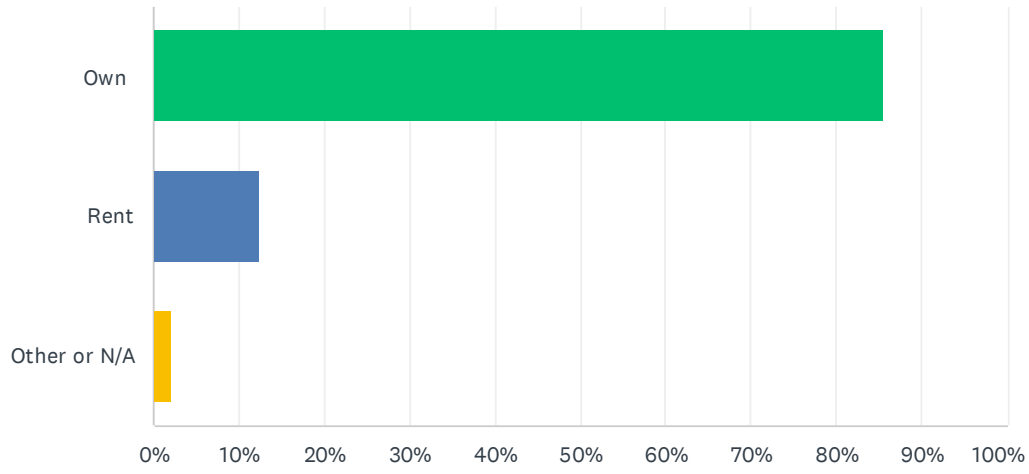

## Q10 Do you own or rent?

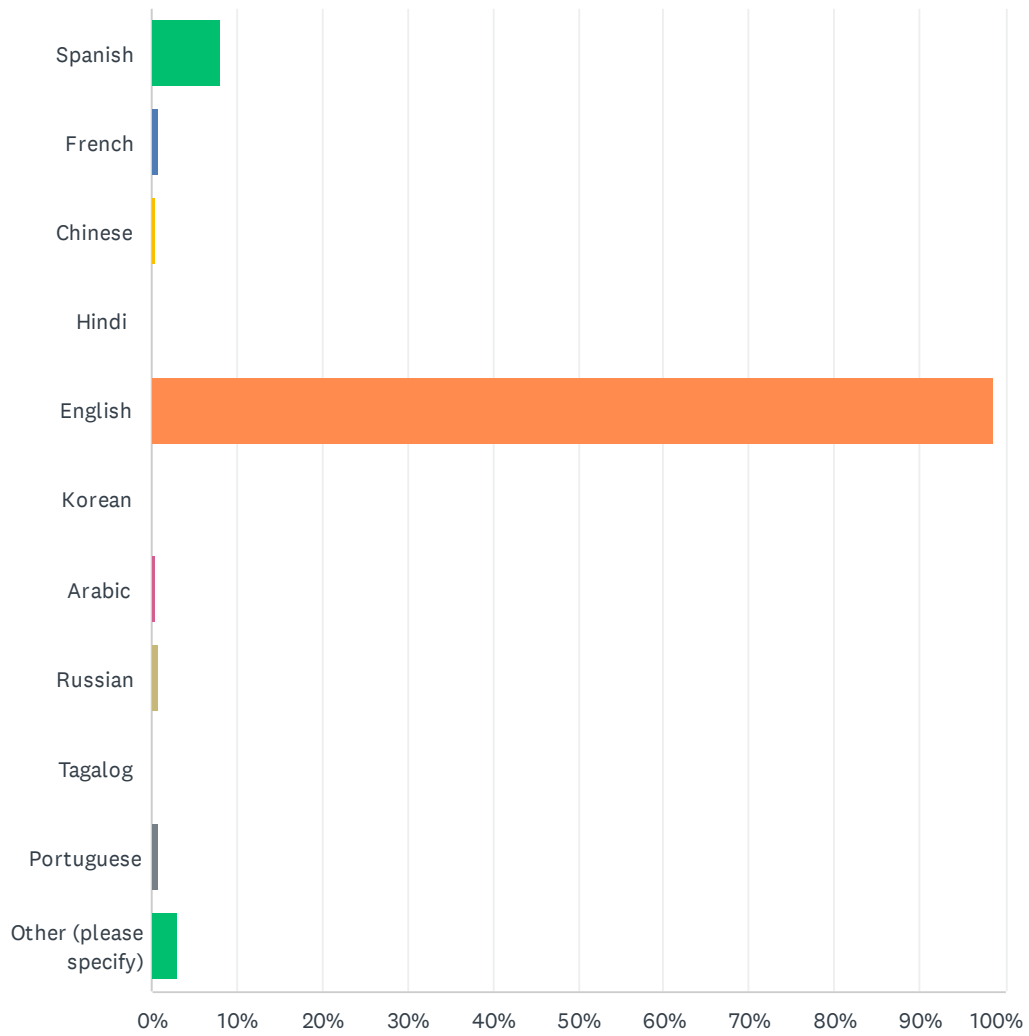

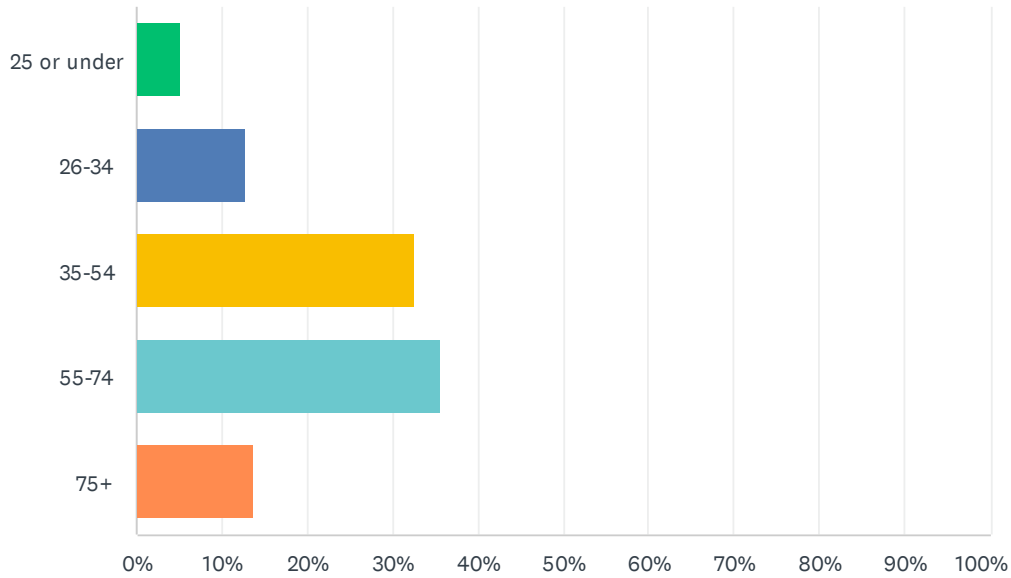
