

S.A.T. Strategies (2016 updates not available)

Desc: For students entering the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade

The focus of this workshop is on successful test-taking skills and reasoning strategies to help students maximize their scores on the SAT. Topics are presented relevant to the math, verbal and writing sections of the test. The program provides over 40 hours of instruction, a pre-test and a post-test as well as periodic evaluations to gauge student progress throughout the workshop. Students also have a follow-up half-day preparation session in during the fall semester prior to the October S.A.T.
